JUST WHAT IS A SCRVRHS CAR ATTENDANT ANYWAY?

Our SCRVRHS Car Attendant Program has been around for as long as the Society has been in existence. One advantage of Society membership has always been the opportunity to become a passenger train crewmember and experience train travel from a totally new perspective. SCRVRHS uniformed car attendants provide three important functions onboard the various Fillmore & Western trains:

SAFETY – Car attendants are primarily responsible for passenger safety. They receive instruction to include assisting passengers in getting on and off of the train; passing between cars; car vestibule and window operation; and the hazards



posed by children running on the train. They remind passengers of the F&W railroad rules such as body parts being outside of the train, outside food, smoking, and shoes on chairs. In case of emergency, all car attendants must be CPR certified (classes available) and many also have formal first aid training. When in doubt or if difficulties arise, car attendants rely on the train conductor for assistance.

INFORMATION – Car Attendants are not just added passengers that ride in a seat the whole trip. They receive formal training on the history of the railroad corridor and the various pieces of equipment operating on the train. They walk the train, monitoring safety, and engaging passengers without imposing themselves on others. They share facts about the interesting points along the route and answer

any questions. This makes the train ride much more interesting for both passengers and car attendants alike while fulfilling the Society's historical and educational goals.

MEMBERSHIP – All car attendants have access to our 'Join Us' brochures either in their possession or available on the train. Attendants act as Society ambassadors offering the brochure to passengers who show more than a passing interest in trains or the activities of the Society. Assisting the Society in gaining new members allows SCRVRHS a greater reach in meeting our goals, completing our projects and sharing the railroading experience with others.

Being a car attendant *IS* truly an opportunity not available everywhere. In addition to F&W trains, once a year, qualified SCRVRHS car attendants also serve on Metrolink high-speed trains during the two weekends of the Ventura County Fair. And the opportunity doesn't stop there. Several brakemen, conductors and even engineers, who work for the Fillmore & Western Railway, are SCRVRHS members who have come up through the ranks starting as SCRVRHS car attendants. The opportunities are here if anyone wants to take advantage of them.
