Society's Second Largest Annual Fundraising Event Needs Volunteers

A funny thing happened on the way to installing the turntable. Seems that material costs recently went up and our grant won't cover all of our installation expenses. So our two major fund raisers, fireworks and Rail Festival, are that much more important to us this year. To make the later a financial success we need your help. Sound like a broken record? The fact is, the more people we end up hiring to fill the manpower needs that our members don't fill, the less money we have to finish the turntable. So if you have time to help, and want some fun at the same time, we welcome you!

Here's what's happening at the Festival this year: the famous SCRVRHS BBQ sandwiches; the Frontier Gunfighters; antique farm equipment; vintage tractors; vintage automobile displays; live steam miniature train rides and musical entertainment.

This year, the Fillmore & Western will again offer one-hour train rides,

with a twist. In addition to traditional pre-1940 heavyweight passenger cars the public can *ride* in an actual caboose (for an additional Society donation).

In addition to our 'Be-An-Engineer' program using the Sespe 0-4-0., 'modern' engineers will have the very rare opportunity to learn how to operate a diesel locomotive. The F&W Railway will offer one-hour certified instructional sessions culminating with students actually operating a modern diesel locomotive. Tours of our 1956 ex-Union Pacific Pullman Sleeping Car #1205 and Santa Fe cupola caboose #474 will be available to the public. Plus, a vintage diesel locomotive will also be available for a 'climb aboard, hands-on' inspection.

The Society's Railroad Visitor Center will be open both days. The Center contains many historical railroad artifacts and displays, an educational library, Lionel model train layout, gift shop, a new live

AROUND THE ROUNDHOUSE . . .

THE UNION PACIFIC FOUNDATION — notified SCRVRHS that they did not fund the \$67,000 grant proposal that we submitted last summer (Train Orders, October 2004). In a letter dated February 1, 2005 they stated "This is not a reflection on the worthiness of your request, but rather the difficulty in making funding decisions." The grant proposal was to improve upon the Railroad Visitor Center and to create a traveling video educational program to bring the Visitor Center experience to schools. SCRVRHS plans to try again this year.

THE SESPE — 1896 0-4-0 Porter steam engine (see photo on p.1) is undergoing repairs in preparation for the Rail Festival. The F&W, aided by our very own Locomotive Workshop crew, is working to have 'the 1 spot's' saddle water tank removed and repaired, injectors cleaned, wooden cab repaired, air compressor rebuilt, and wooden 'bumper' replaced. That's important in that the Festival's 2005 'Be a Steam Engineer' program has sold out for Saturday and is well on it's way to selling out for Sunday's rides as well. Last year, donations for the Sespe program brought the Society nearly \$1,400. 2005 will be a sell-out too!

VENTURA COUNTY LIVE STEAMERS — have placed on loan in our Visitor Center, a very special live steam locomotive in an eight foot glass case. Built by one of their members and finished by others shortly after his passing, this engine is so beautiful it even has 24k gold plated steam domes and other parts. Come see it to appreciate it.
