## RAILFEST 2013 March 23rd - 24th

### Sister to Railfest Star Baldwin 2-8-0 #14 Hasn't Been as Lucky

The Duluth & Northern Minnesota was a logging railroad based in the town of Knife River. Of all the surviving Duluth & Northeastern engines, the closest to her old stomping grounds is 2-8-0 no. 16, on static display in Fauley Park in the D&NE's home town of Cloquet. This nicely proportioned consolidation was built by Baldwin in 1913. Although she is unroofed and unfenced, the engine is very well cared for. But not operational like her Fillmore based #14 sister.

D&NM 2-8-0 #14 was restored to steam in 1992 for excursions on the North Shore Scenic Railroad. The engine also masqueraded as a Great Northern engine for the Disney film "Iron Will". #14 was taken out of service in August, 1998. She is currently owned by the Fillmore & Western Railway Company, fully restored and operational. See her at Railfest 2013.

The Santa Clara River Valley Railroad Historical Society (SCRVRHS), will celebrate its 20th anniversary with "Railfest 2013" on March 23rd and 24th in Central Park, Fillmore, California. Hours are 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. each day. Admission and parking are free. For a Railfest brochure go to www.scrvrhs.com.

Railfest 2013 will feature Fillmore & Western Railways' fully operating & restored Baldwin 1913 "Consolidation" type steam locomotive #14. This locomotive, a 2-8-0, will be powering the "Railfest Special Event" train including a caboose with three train departures each day of the event. A daytime diesel train will be pulling a Scenic Excursion train to Santa Paula, CA. Saturday evening a diesel powered Family Murder Mystery Dinner train will travel west from Fillmore and back, departing at 6:30pm. Another dinner train on Saturday night will be pulled by the Baldwin steam engine and features a boxed BBQ dinner provided by SCRVRHS. It will depart Fillmore at 5:30pm and head east to Piru before returning to Fillmore at 8:30pm. These vintage trains will consist mostly of traditional pre-1940 heavyweight and also streamliner passenger and dining cars. Advance tickets for all trains are available at www.fwry.com or by calling 805-524-2546.

In addition to train rides, Railfest 2013 offers many railroad-related venues such as 'Speeder' rides and informational displays from various railroad-related organizations. There will be Arts and Crafts booths, Model RR Trains in various scales and some unique food vendors, including SCRVRHS' very own Tri-Tip BBQ sandwiches. Other attractions include performances by the famous Frontier Gunfighters and displays of antique farm equipment and vintage automobiles. The Fillmore Historical Society and Museum will be giving guided tours of the Fillmore RR Depot, Bunk House and Hinckley Home. Walking tours through an original 1956 Union Pacific Pullman Sleeping Car, the "National Embassy" and a Santa Fe caboose, the "Vicky V", will be available. Also, a Pacific Fruit Exchange (PFE) boxcar will be on display.

Docents will demonstrate the Society's vintage 1906 RR Turntable throughout the event and provide information and details about the equipment. The turntable, used to turn around locomotives and railcars, is one of the first to be installed in California in over 50 years. The RR Turntable is 96 feet long and weighs in at 85 tons. It was purchased from the Canadian National Railroad and is now located in Fillmore on Main St. between Central Ave. and Mountain View just east of the historic Fillmore Depot.

Also, the SCRVRHS Railroad Visitor Center, located across from Fillmore's Central Park at 455 Main Street, will be open. It contains many historical railroad artifacts, a Lionel "0" gauge model-train layout, a gift shop, and a 20-seat digital theater with surround sound.

SCRVRHS' "Buy-A-Brick" program will be offering bricks with your name, family, organization, company or other slogan engraved on the "RR Brick". The bricks will be used to beautify and enhance a new walkway from Main St. to the promenade. Donations to the "Buy-A-Brick" are tax deductible.

Most of the Railfest proceeds benefit SCRVRHS and its railroad restoration efforts. Donations to the Santa Clara River Valley Railroad Historical Society, a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, are tax deductible.

St. Francis Dam Disaster Tour — Santa Clarita Valley Historical Society will present a tour of the St. Francis Dam site on Saturday, March 16, 2013, just 4 days after the 85th anniversary of the second-worst natural disaster to hit California. The failure of the St. Francis Dam on March 12, 1928 killed more than 450 people, leveled farms and homesteads, destroyed property and livestock and changed the way dam safety was addressed forevermore. The tour will begin at 11 a.m. in the freight room of the Saugus Train Station in Heritage Junction then travel by bus to the actual dam site. Tickets are \$35 per person for all ages and include snacks and bus transportation. Call (661) 254-1275. Participants should wear long pants and comfortable hiking shoes. Water will be provided.
