Turntable Delayed CalTrans Asks For More Studies

It has been nine months since we submitted our turntable construction plans to the California Department of Transportation (CalTrans) on June 28, 2002. This was to be the final hurdle prior to issuing bids for construction. But the one big hurdle has turned into several lengthy little hurdles.

First, SCRVRHS was required to do a geologic core drilling study deep into the earth. This was to make sure that the ground was stable enough to allow for our four foot deep turntable pit excavation. We passed.

In our last episode. CalTrans required that we check the site for Native American significance. It ordered a survey of the property which 1) took time and; 2) cost money. Society grant money. After review it was determined that no Native American importance was related to the site. We again thought approval was finally pending.

In this episode CalTrans has now ordered another core inspection, this time for any hazardous material that may be on the site (too bad this couldn't have happened simultaneously with the geologic study). Stan Hurst, SCRVRHS member and long time Fillmore resident, recalls that the only hazardous thing that he can recall ever landed on this property was horse dung! Dung from a horse corral that was there early in the 20th century. Nevertheless, we are spending \$3900. for a 'lowest bid' professional inspection from a CalTrans approved list of vendors to certify the site as hazardous material free. How long this takes and what other needs may be 'revealed' prior to a CalTrans final approval is any ones guess.

Our \$250,000 in government grants called for construction to start by 2003. These delays threatened the loss of these monies. Fortunately the Society was able to have the construction deadline extended, preserving our money. Now we again wait and hope. Stay tuned for the next episode!
