SCRVRHS Turn Table Construction Continues:

The month April has seen many changes in the turntable property: The grading East of the turntable was completed several weeks ago at a very reasonable cost by members of the "Live Steamers." A big "Thank You" to Ken Shaner and his crew for getting this aspect of the work completed. In addition to the new ties, we have secured at very reasonable cost (thanks to Mark Aston), five storm drain collection fixtures, sixty feet of 12 inch drain pipe and other related ductile iron piping necessary to complete the storm drain system. The new drains will be located 20 feet East of the turntable. We have received the "green light" from the City of Fillmore to continue this portion of the construction and soon we will begin the drainage system. Metrolink donated 250 new railroad ties for the completion of our "Three Tracks East" Project. Pictured below are Jimmy Treloar and Tim Mason who donated their time and efforts to moving the ties from the Metrolink Taylor yard to our turntable site. The F&W Crew supplied the necessary forklift to unload...Thank You Metrolink, Jimmy, Tim and

the F&W Crew! While work is progressing on the storm drains, we are undertaking the permit process for the electrical work and the installation of tracks east of the turntable. We are currently looking for an electrical contractor to design the detailed electrical plans for submission to the city. Also, during this time we are evaluating other sources for fencing for the site that will be more aesthetically pleasing to our visitors and we are evaluating the cost of steel fencing around the turntable.
