A VISIT TO THE BLACK HILLS CENTRAL



The Black Hills Central Railroad in South Dakota has the only operational Mallet locomotive in the United States. Engine No.110 was built in 1928 for the Weyerhaeuser Timber Co. for service in Vail, WA. In 1954 it was sold to Rayonier Inc. and was operated on the Grays Harbor Line until 1966; it was retired from service in 1968. Before being purchased by the Black Hill Central Railroad in 1999, No. 110 had several 'homes'. From 1968 to 1971, the locomotive was on display in Salt Lake City at the Promontory chapter of the National Railway Historical Society. From 1971 – 1993 it was on display at the Wasatch Railroad Museum in Heber City, Utah; from 1993 to 1999, it was in storage at the Nevada State RR Museum in Boulder City, NV. Under the ownership of the Black Hills Central RR, locomotive No. 110 was completely rebuilt before going in to service in January 2001.

The locomotive is 46 ft. 8 in. in length, has 44 in. drivers and weighs 222,000 lbs. The high pressure cylinders have a 17 in. bore with a 24 in. stroke, and the low pressure cylinders have a 26 in. bore with a 24 in. stroke. The boiler contains 124 2-inch-diameter, 17 foot-long flues, and eighteen 5 1/2-inch-diameter superheater tubes; it has two pop safety valves set a 198 psi and 200 psi. The split-saddle tank capacity is 2500 gallons. With a tractive effort of 37,500 lbs. the locomotive easily pulls a 210 ton, seven car consist over the nine mile route between Hill City and Keystone, SD. even with grades of 4 – 6 percent. By comparison, when No. 110 is not in service, the same consist of six wood coaches and an ex-Chicago & Northern drover's caboose requires two double heading 2-6-2 locomotives to make the grades. Did You Know: George Westinghouse's many inventions rank him with Thomas A. Edison and Werner Von Siemens as founding fathers of our electrified world. Yet, ironically, Westinghouse's first invention, a railroad brake that he patented in 1869, was actuated not by electrons but by air. To this day, most railroads rely on that systems principal of releasing air from a pressurized pipe that runs the length of the train and brakes the cars one after another, at a rate of 498 ft/sec (152 meters/sec).
