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# **SCRVRHS Fireworks Booth Moves to New, More Beautiful and Cost-Effective Location**

131 East Telegraph Boulevard (Highway 126) will be the new location for the SCRVRHS 2012 TNT Fireworks booth. Located in a shaded,



tree filled park setting, the booth eliminates additional operating costs such as site rent, site clearing and grading, water truck usage (dust), and fence relocation that were incurred in past years. Located near Pole Creek on the north side of Highway 126 as you enter Fillmore

from the east, this new location will aid in the overall profits of the most important, fund raising activity of this non-profit organizations' year.

Due to a loss in income from the 2012 Railfest rainout, this year's fireworks effort is really important in supporting the society goals of a concrete surround and fencing for the turntable project. "Our general fund suffered an unexpected hit recently and we could use the fireworks money to assist with our mission", said Ron Lewis, SCRVRHS President.
