Each year in August, since the inception of Ventura County Fair Metrolink service, the Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC) has invited the Santa Clara River Valley Railroad Historical Society members to participate in a truly exclusive experience. Our role, as defined by Metrolink, is for our members to be 'Ambassadors' aboard the trains. Our responsibility is to ensure passenger safety by assisting in the boarding, de-training, and in-route safety of the passengers (making sure aisles and stairwells are clear and passable. We also pass out Operation Lifesaver safety material to kids as well as do a passenger count both coming in and departing the Ventura station. Sound similar to our Car Attendant program? It is! In fact most, but not all, of our volunteers are trained, experienced Car Attendants.

For our service in 2002, VCTC donated some \$750. for our services. So it's a double treat. We participate in mainline railroad activity at 75 mph as part of the train crew and get paid for it at the same time! Not to mention that



in past years, VCTC gave each Car Attendant a voucher for lunch at the fair plus a free pass for their family members. Can't beat that. But because of these financial obligations, we need to perform. That again means that we need volunteers.

Certainly if you are a qualified SCRVRHS Car Attendant, we need you. If you have always wanted to be a Car Attendant, now's your chance. Chief Car Attendant Don Hatch can train you in the basics and schedule you for an initial in-service training on a Fillmore & Western train run. All Car Attendants

are required to wear our standard uniform of dark blue pants, white shirt, solid dark blue tie, black shoes (boots preferable), and dark blue suspenders (or optional dark blue vest). A conductors hat or engineers hat is also required. A pocket flashlight (required for train crews by the FRA), notebook and writing pen are also helpful. An inexpensive counter available at any stationary store saves using your fingers and toes. Don can give you all of the information necessary. Look for his telephone number on the Dispatch Board (p.2) and give him a call.



VCTC operates two (2) Fair trains per day over the two fair weekends in August. That obviously means that we need two crews per day of at least four (4) Car Attendants each. Our crews meet and are picked up by Metrolink at the Moorpark Metrolink Station. Trains then deadhead to Chatsworth where we pick up the first passengers. If you bring a scanner to listen to both the Metrolink crews and Union Pacific dispatchers, you truly are in the middle of all of the action! Join us! This is an railroad experience that only comes with SCRVRHS membership. It's just for you. Take advantage of a good thing that only comes around once a year. See you onboard!!



Cal Trans Comes Through, Turntable Moves Forward

After literally loosing our initial hazardous material study report, CalTrans came through on their promise to move our resubmitted report to the top of the list and make a quick review of things.

SCRVRHS President Pat Askren recently received a verbal approval of our turntable installation plans based on a favorable hazardous material report. The beat goes on!



Now the real work begins. The next step toward installation is to prepare drawings and documents for use in soliciting bids. Once completed, bid requests will be sent to local contractors for review and return. A construction company will be chosen and hopefully, construction will begin by this October. The Society has nearly a quarter of a million dollars of state transportation grants for this portion of the plan. The Society's share of matching funds comes to about \$75,000, money that the Society has already set aside. As developments continue to unfold, we'll keep you informed.
