CAR ATTENDANT PROGRAM UPDATE

Since its inception in 1993 SCRVRHS has been providing car attendants on board the Fillmore & Western railroad excursions for the benefit of the railway and the passengers. Presently there is a "cadre" of attendants who take ride in their role, providing safety pfor the riders and information about the scenes along the railroad corridor. They also work aboard the Metrolink County Fair trains in the August time period, with Metrolink providing a donation to SCRVRHS for providing the service. The Society is looking for more volunteers, and the point of contact is Fred Ervast, (805) 389-0787, fastfinn@verizon.net, who will arrange for training.

- A. One should be trained and certified in CPR;
- B. An attendant must receive "on-the-job" training on how to assist people in boarding and getting off the train;
- C. He/she should learn about safety features about the train and proper techniques in using a hand-held radio;
- D. The car attendant should show "people skills" in greeting the passengers, giving facts and historical perspectives about the railroad and the scenes along the corridor;
- E. The car attendant is responsible for obtaining his or her uniform. SCRVRHS will try to assist the person in this regard, such as passing on uniforms which have been handed in or donated, giving information where to get certain uniform items, etc. But it is up to the attendant to be in a uniform that will identify him or herself as one no jeans, tee shirts and coveralls! In the last General Meeting, 16 members participated in our Society Sponsored CPR training session. We applaud those who took the time to learn this valuable skill. You never know when your CPR expertise may save a life...

SCRVRHS would like to give recognition to member *Robert Bennet*, who has given much of his time almost every weekend in volunteering as a car attendant and a brakeman. Well done, Robert!

AROUND THE ROUNDHOUSE ...

Did You Know, by Jim Mendrala, Director:

In the United States, the term "consist" is used to describe a group of rail vehicles which make up a "train". When referring to motive power, "consist" refers to the group of locomotives powering the train. Similarly, the term "trainset" refers to a group of rolling stock that is permanently or semi-permanently coupled together to form a unified set of equipment (the term is most often applied to passenger train configurations). The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway's 1948 operating rules define a train as: "An engine or more than one engine coupled, with or without cars, displaying markers." However in the United Kingdom, the interchangeable terms set and unit are used to refer to a group of permanently or semipermanently coupled vehicles, such as those of a multiple unit while referring to a "train". When made up of a variety of vehicles, or of several sets/units, the term "formation" is used. (Although the UK public and media often forgo 'formation', for simply 'train'.) The word "rake" is used for a group of coaches or wagons. Railways Act In the United Kingdom Section 83(1) of the t 1993 defines "train" as follows: "Two or more items of rolling stock coupled together, at least one of which is a locomotive or a locomotive not coupled to any other rolling stock. "

MILEPOST PROGRAM LOOKING FOR SPONSORS

Since 1997, SCRVRHS has been installing mileposts along the railroad corridor from Piru to Santa Paula as a fundraising project for the Society. These mileposts are built to Southern Pacific specifications that were in place prior to the 1950's! The locations of the mileposts are based on historical records when Southern Pacific built and operated the lines starting in the 1880's. The mileposts are not only recognized by the Fillmore & Western Railway as specific points along the line but are also identified on maps used by the local fire and law enforcement departments.

Once again, the Society is looking for sponsors that would donate funds to build and install these markers. For a donation of \$200.00, SCRVRHS will build and install a milepost and will include a metal plaque designating the donor. If you desire, more than one person can combine funds and purchase a milepost, and all parties would be identified on the plaque. If one desires to dedicate a milepost in honor of a person, an IN MEMORIAM designation can be included on the plaque.

There is an immediate need for a sponsor for MILEPOST 425. The location is approximately 100 feet east of Pole Creek in Fillmore.

Another part of this fundraising program is the sponsorship of siding signs which were in place along the corridor during the early part of the 20th Century. These are being rebuilt and installed by SCRVRHS in accordance with specifications in that time period, and the cost to sponsor one is only \$100.00. Again, a plaque would be placed on the post recognizing the donor. All net proceeds go to the Railroad Interpretive Center program account.
