SCRVRHS Applies For Restoration Grant

Thanks to Gary Phillips and Jim Mendrala, the Society has applied for a <u>TRAINS</u> Magazine \$10,000 grant to be used toward the exterior restoration of our #1205 UP National Embassy sleeper. Limited to only 200 words (below), results of the effort will come in mid November.

"The Santa Clara River Valley Railroad Historical Society, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, was established in 1993 to assist in the preservation and restoration of the railroad corridor between Montalvo and Saugus, California. One of our goals is to preserve, exhibit, and operate historic railroad equipment.

In February 2000, the Society acquired the former Union Pacific National Embassy Pullman, built in 1956. It is one of fifteen cars, comprising the National Series, which was part of the City of St. Louis passenger train consist. Although the car's interior is in near original pristine condition, its exterior aluminum siding has extensive corrosion caused by exposure to an ocean environment from its previous storage in Santa Barbara, CA. The Society is seeking funds to renovate and restore the exterior of this historic railroad car to its original condition.

Recognizing that complete restoration will exceed the amount of this grant, the monies would be applied to Phase I which is to repair the severe corrosion around windows and skirt area, thereby preventing interior water damage. The City of Fillmore has historical significance as a railroad community, and a restored "Pullman Car" would be a great centerpiece to complement our Society's operational railroad turntable".





HOLLYWOOD MAGIC — The tender tank on the F&W #14 Baldwin was basically rebuilt from scratch by SCRVRHS member Bob Mahans' steel company, using just the original ends and filling in from there. So the new exterior sides are made of heavy gauge flat steel. No rivets required! But to simulate the original tender look, 'rivets' were added. But if you look closely along the top edge of the tender you'll see missing 'rivets' in the line going from the word 'Fillmore' to nearly the corner of the tender. These fiberglass 'rivet' dots, used to simulate the real thing, weren't able to be glued on prior to the #14's unveiling in January. Can you believe that each little rivet had to be glued on! Hollywood magic indeed! That's why they call the F&W The Movie Train.

EXPLORE OLD RAILROAD DEPOTS

The Southern Pacific Railroad (SPR) arrived in the Santa Clara River Valley in 1887. During its march to the sea, SPR built several common standard depots along its route. From Saugus to Ventura California and overtime connecting Los Angeles to San Francisco with its new coastal route. Historian Jean-Guy Dube will give a talk on the Southern Pacific Railroad Depots of the Santa Clara River Valley before the Santa Clarita Valley Historical Society at 1 pm on Saturday, December 10, 2011. The talk will be conducted at the Saugus Train Station at Heritage Junction within William S. Hart Park, a unit of the County of Los Angeles Department of Parks and Recreation System, 24101 Newhall Avenue, in Newhall, California. This lecture will focus on some of these depots of the Santa Clara River Valley and will include their history, plans, features, building materials and

Jean-Guy Dube is an apprenticing architect and architectural historian. He has been researching Southern Pacific's depots since 1985. In 2001, he applied his work experience in architectural drafting to re-creating blueprints of some of Southern Pacific's common standard depots. He has architectural history degrees from The University of California and is employed by one of the top 100 architects in the United States, Architect Marc Appleton.
