It May Be December, But Preparation Is Well Underway for Rail Festival 2006



Here's an update from our two co-chairpersons of the 2006 Rail Festival, Don Hatch and Jim Mendrala. The theme for this year's event will be "Railroad History Rolling By". As usual it is scheduled for the third weekend in March which happens to be March 18th and 19th. At the urging of the Fillmore & Western, the Festival is proposed to be a bit different from previous years in that it is planned to be 'regional' and conducted not only in Fillmore, but Santa Paula and Piru as well! Plans call for two F&W trains operating in both directions (hence the theme) and an all day ticket pass to ride the trains. Don Hatch is checking out the possibility of having hand car races in Piru. The plans for Santa Paula include a Metrolink train set display and an art show.

Vendor solicitations should be in the mail next week with labels being supplied by the F&W. Member Bob Mahan may expand on his speeder rides and the #1 Sespe will again feature the very popular 'Be An Engineer' program. As Don Hatch says "Nothing is in concrete yet". YOU WENT WHERE? DID WHAT? — two SCRVRHS members recently journeyed on separate train adventures:

Ron Lewis visited Shanghai China where he rode the most modern of maglev trains at 431 kilometers per hour (258 mph). Maglev's, or magnetic levitating, are trains that travel on a cushion of 'air' using a polarized magnetic field instead of wheels on steel tracks powered by diesel/electric.

Dennis Hanley spent two weeks in Colorado actually working on the Durango & Silverton narrow gauge railroad. He helped with general repairs, drove a speeder in his work, and managed a cab ride or two on a steam locomotive!
