

"Did You Know"

Great Western Engine No. 51: A 1906, 2-8-0 Baldwin owned by John Birmingham of CO was built for the "Great Western Railway" of Colorado, a subsidiary of the Great Western Sugar Co. The engine was use seasonally by the GW to head up sugar beet trains, including pushing gondola cars up on the "Highline" in Windsor. She was sold to Birmingham in 1963 reportedly for the price of scrap iron. No. 51 also provided power for many excursion trains on her home rails. No. 51 was moved to Fillmore in the early 1990's. This engine saw use in many movies during her career, including several shoots at the Fillmore and Western Rwy, prior to the engine's return to Colorado. ONE OF MY FAVORITE PICTURES FOR 2009...

While looking though my pictures of 2009 SCRVRHS events, I again came across this photo of the Sespe, under steam, on the Turntable for the first time in history. It was taken during the 2009 Railfest. The Sespe is dwarfed by the size of our Turntable, but still it is a memorable picture. For me, two important facts are in this picture: First, it represents over 10 years of planning, labor, and hope for the site, plus

the transportation and installation of our Turntable. It demonstrates what can be accomplished with literally hundreds of hours of work, selling T-Shirts, sandwiches, Speeders Rides at Railfest, Society Car Attendant Time, Ventura County Fair Train Attendants and the fantastic support given us by the City of Fillmore along with the Fillmore and Western Rwy. Second, the picture shows the fruition of much labor on the Sespe to bring the

engine back to life for the 2009 Railfest. The frozen



throttle valve gland was repaired (no small task) plus cleaning, oiling and grate/ash pan installation. Again, this hard and dirty work was accomplished by Society Volunteers, principally Director Ken Van Fleet. I hope you enjoy this historic photo as much as I do for what it Ron Lewis represents.
